The statistics call for fast intervention sickle through promoting screening at birth and at all stages. UNHLS is having the capacity to conduct sickle screening at all stages.

Effective 02nd February 2017, the Central Public Health Laboratory (CPHL) facility of UNHLS attained SANAS competence for a defined scope and the operation of a quality management system in Medical Testing Laboratory Molecular Virology. The South African National Accreditation System (SANAS) is a nationally and internationally recognized body to carry out conformity assessment of laboratory facilities and recognize their competences including knowledge, skills and ability to provide laboratory services.
